
Newcastle Local SOLIDARITY FEDERATION May Day Bulletin

Industrial Organising

Successes in showing a united front to bullying bosses, a campaign to end increased workloads by refusing to take repairs & maintenance calls from another city and an ongoing collective pay negotiation, demonstrate the importance of small victories in giving workers the confidence to engage in workplace struggle and build autonomous union-like organisation.

Abolish Workfare

Workfare is the name used for a range of schemes in which people are forced to work without wages as a condition of receiving their benefits. Newcastle SolFed were on Northumberland St, highlighting the use of this unpaid labour recently. High street chains, Poundland, Holland & Barrett and Marks and Spencer have all been targeted by Newcastle SolFed members & as ever there's a positive response from the public.

We were supporting comrades from Spain (CNT) & Argentina (FORA) who were holding actions to highlight abuses of workers' rights. We were joined by two comrades from the Italian anarcho-syndicalist union USI as we picketed city-centre branches.

There was lots of interest from workers on their lunch-break for whom solidarity needs little explanation. Most people on Tyneside have friends or family who have suffered erosion of their rights & our presence today was well received. Several suits from HSBC bank attempted to block us however their attempts at intimidation only served to illustrate what bankers they are!
